Message from Pastor Glenn

From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,



Early one evening, many years ago, as I sat content and relaxed in my living room recliner, heavy machinery began removing the roadway surface outside our home causing the earth to shake. As the sounds and vibrations varied in intensity, I began to think of the shear amount of physical force and

power needed to shake my recliner from such a distance. Granted this activity didn't last very long, but there were times when I wondered if they were working in the next room; soon to break through the wall. For the next few nights, we experienced a similar practice. In the quietness of the evening, the earth moving machines would suddenly shake the ground. Then after listening to powerful machinery and feeling the house shake for a few minutes, peace would once again return to the neighborhood.

The road construction crew had been working on the street for many weeks, but their initial work began several blocks away. The street had been dug up, and nearby sat amazingly large boulders that had been excavated. In one lawn, I saw a rock was larger than a small car! I saw front yards in disarray and the sod overturned. I saw that that my neighbor's water supply had been disconnected for many hours and now the temporary water supply lines lay exposed in their front yards. I saw that their driveways had been torn up and they had to park their vehicles on the next block each evening. The loud sounds and the ground shaking must have been going on for quite a while, but it didn't affect our area. That activity was blocks away and hardly noticeable.

Now all of those things that had happened to my neighbors down the street were happening on our block! When road work moved within a stone's throw away from our home, it suddenly became very noticeable; it became personal. Earlier, I lightly took notice of how it was for my neighbors down the street, but now I realize in my seeing, how much I really failed to see. I realize that this was a perfect opportunity to have my recliner "shaken."

Maybe when we see from afar our neighbor enduring inconveniences or hardships, we see it and know that it is happening, but we can easily turn away, only seeing what is happening on the surface. From a distance, we don't hear the

same noise or feel the earth shake, until we are in the depths of a similar situation. As brothers and sisters in Christ, we need to be sensitive and compassionate toward others that are affected in ways that we cannot readily see, in ways that we cannot readily feel.

The word, "mission" can create images of needy people in other countries, but in order for our mission field to grow, we must first begin serving those within our reach; in our church and our local communities. There will always be a construction zone somewhere that is going to affect a neighbor at some time. We shouldn't wait for a construction zone to surround us, before we realize that there will always be people in need. Our vison must widen to see all around us. Our eyes must realize our neighbor's needs beyond what we only see at the surface.

May we see beyond our own comfort and peace, when our skies are blue and our pathways are straight and smoothly surfaced. May we take time to reach out to friends, relatives, and neighbors to see if they need a gentle hand or a kind word of comfort and peace from the daily trials that can shake our world. May we boldly share the peace of God as we have been commanded to do and may we share the Good News of Jesus Christ and the hope of the resurrection as we reach out to one another in faith, hope, and love.



August is normally the month that we begin our school year. As we all know, though, nothing about 2020 is normal! This year school will start after



This year's graduates are Grace McLean, Ellie Rujan, Gloriel Salas, and Grace Shupe. They will also be recognized in church at a later date to be determined.
- Title I teacher Susan Hass is providing tutoring for about 6 students for four weeks over the summer. Her hours are being paid for by Title I funding through Lakers. The school is paying her a small stipend as well.
